THE BARRY MOTOR

Not many cars and motorcycles have been made in Wales, however I came across a snippet in the Western Mail of 1 September 1905 that announced that "The Barry Motor Company" had been formed to manufacture the "Barry Motor" and cars and motor cycles generally.

Mike Worthington-Williams has very kindly supplied me with some information on the firm.

It seems that the "Barry" motor was a rotary engine of at least two cylinders and they made motorbikes fitted with it up to at least 1908.


THE DUDLEY FOLLAND CAR (Continued)

Last month we ended with the car being imported in to the UK in rather dubious circumstances. Dudley Folland entered the car for the Easter Goodwood meeting in 1949. The car won the "Lavant Cup" from a Cisitalia and Jack Fairman's Riley, but according to my researches it was not driven by Folland (the entrant) but by Peter Wilks of Rover and Marauder sports car fame.

Folland, though, definitely campaigned the car in Formula 2 races on the Continent at Pau, Rheims (4th) and Angouleme Circuit des Remparts (5th). He also entered the Manx Cup race on the Isle of Man, where he was in second place gaining on the leader, Moss, before retiring with clutch failure. In addition he finished 3rd in the Wakefield Trophy at the Curragh, Eire. He also shared Peter Whitehead's 1½ litre supercharged monoposto Formula 1 Ferrari (the second Ferrari to come to Britain) in the 1948 British GP at Silverstone, finishing 8th.

John Wyer competed with the car in sprints and hillclimbs, including Weston-super-Mare (2ndin class). According to Wyer years later, it was, in hindsight a mistake to enter the car in Formula 2 events against the lighter Gordinis as it was really a two-seater. It could have been raced in sports-car races, with the fitting of cycle-type wings and headlights etc (as it has today).

In the autumn of 1949 the car was sent back to Modena, much to the relief of Folland and Wyer! It was then apparently race by Cortese in the 1950 Naples GP, presumably with the Red Dragon of wales still emblazoned on the nose.

POSTSCRIPT

Dudley Folland, who worked at Richard Thomas & Baldwins' steel works at Ebbw Vale retired from racing in 1950. John Wyer, however, became very well known in British motor racing, going on to be in succession racing manager/director of Aston martin, Ford GT40 and JW Automotive Gulf teams, with great success in each case.

Dudley Folland died in 1979, aged 66. He is buried in the family mausoleum, an impressive monument, in Oystermouth Cemetery. His wife, Betty, died in 1988.

The car No.0101 was subsequently sold to John Willment and then was owned for many years by the late Paul Jackman, a former Aston martin works engineer. The car was featured in an article by Doug Nye in the now sadly defunct bimonthly magazine "Historic Race & Rally", where some of my information was obtained.

The car is now registered 328 DEL.







Dear Sir (or Madam),

The CAIO FAIR TWO RIVERS RUN for Classic Cars is being planned to take place in conjunction with CAIO Fair on the 24th August 1996. The event is being jointly organised by the Swansea Historic Vehicles Register (now celebrating its 20th year) and the CAIO Show Committee. The road run will start in Dinefwr Park and proceed along the Towi Valley to Rhandirmyn via Bethlehem, Llangadog and Llandovery. Once at Rhandirmyn, the run will continue up the valley to cross the Towi Bridge and proceed to the picturesque village of CAIO via Cwrt-Y-Cadno. The run itself will be approximately 50 to 60 miles with the latter stage being conducted on single track roads. The route is being planned to pass through what must be some of the most scenic countryside that South Wales has to offer.

This will be the first year of the event which hopefully will grow progressively in a controlled fashion. Should the event prove to be popular, it will be re-run as an annual event with CAIO show and be extended to include a further run on the August Bank Holiday Sunday. This will then provide a weekend of classic car motoring in the area, which will culminate at the ORLLWYN TEIFI VINTAGE SHOW near Llandysul which is always held on Bank Holiday Monday. Should there be sufficient interest this year, an unofficial run will be held on the Sunday in conjunction with a number of South Wales classic car clubs. Details of this will be provided when the route and venues have been finalised.

The cost for the CAIO FAIR TWO RIVERS RUN will be £10 per car. This will include rally plaques, brass plaques to be supplied by the CAIO show committee and barbecue tickets for two people. The major component of the cost will be the barbecue tickets such that additional barbecue tickets will be £3:50 per head. The first cars will leave Dinefwr Park around 10:30 and hence all cars will be required to be assembled at Dinefwr Park at 10:00 am for a quick briefing and collection of rally plaques and route maps. A rally number and programme will be sent to entrants nearer the date.


